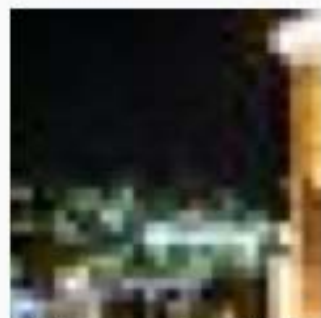

BATTLE OF PLATAEA

The **Battle of Plataea** was the final land battle during the second Persian invasion of Greece. It took place in 479 BC near the city of Plataea in Boeotia, and was fought between an alliance of the Greek city-states, including Sparta, Athens, Corinth and Megara, and the Persian Empire of Xerxes I.

The part which is now in front of the Blue Mosque, is the column, while the base of the monument is still in Delphi.

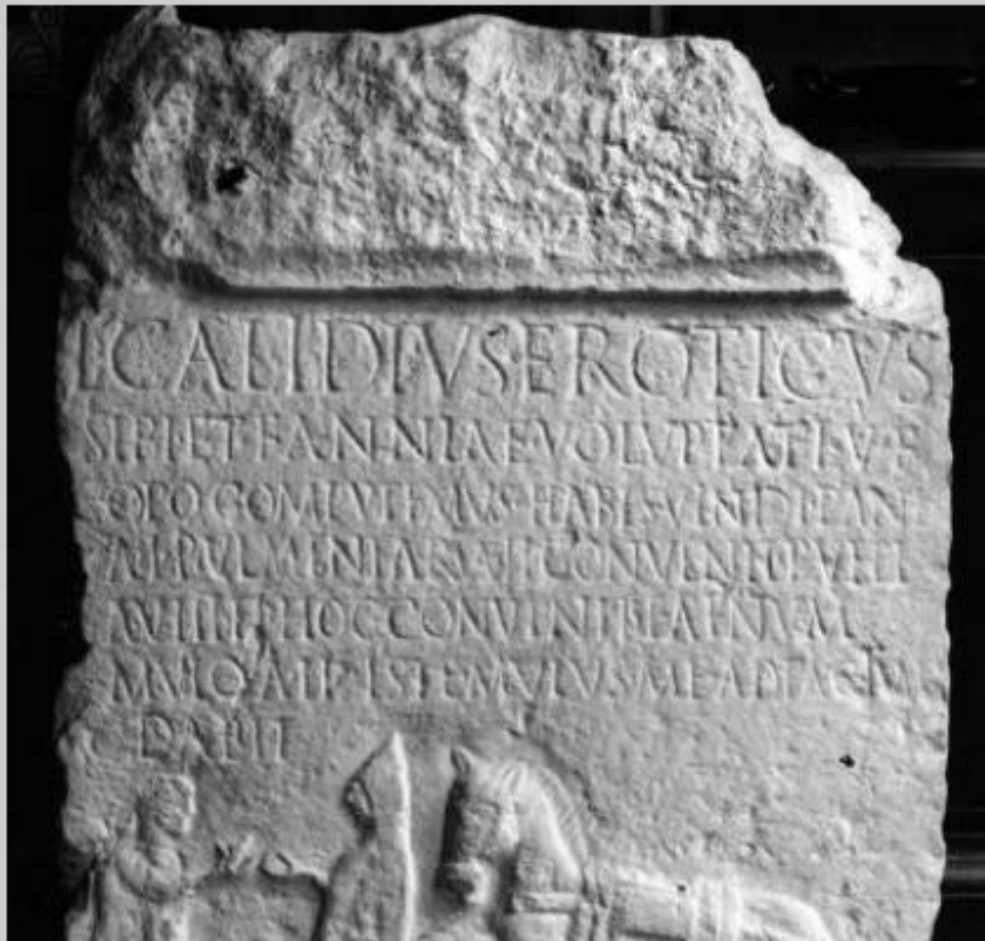

AS (ROMAN COIN)

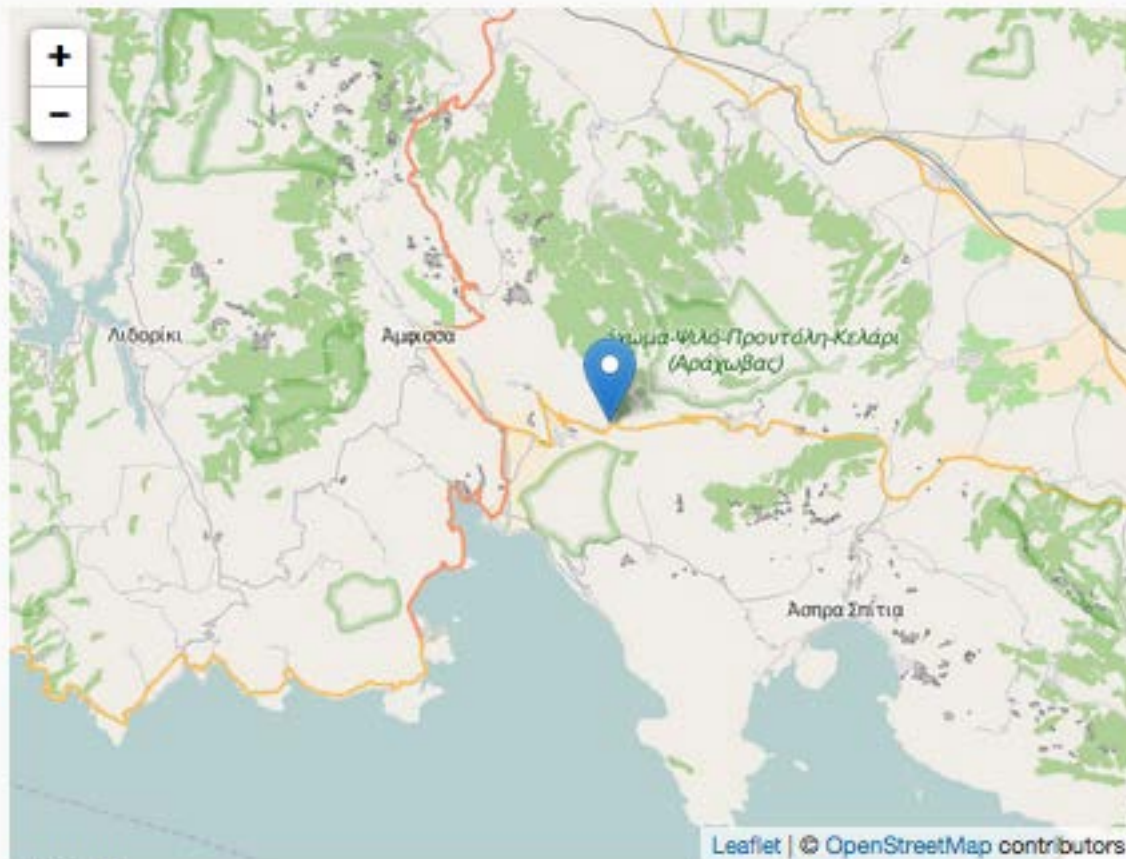
The *as* (plural *asses*), also *assarius* (rendered into Greek as ἀσσάριον, *assarion*) was a bronze, and later copper, coin used during the Roman Republic and Roman Empire.

This column became a landmark because it marked a deed of such importance and probably also for this reason, Constantine decided at the beginning of the 4th century CE, almost a thousand years later to move it to his newly build capital of the Roman Empire, Constantinople. He took the column, but the base stayed there in Delphi.
